Nominate Now



Don't Stay Connected

(Hints from 'Max Secure Software') Disconnect your computer from the Internet when you aren't using it: The developments of technologies such as DSL and cable modems have made it possible for users to be online all the time, but this convenience comes with risks.

The likelihood that attackers or viruses scanning the network for available computers will target your computer becomes much higher if your computer is always connected.

Depending on what method you use to connect to the Internet, disconnecting may mean disabling a wireless connection, turning off your computer or modem, or disconnecting cables.


When you are connected, make sure that you have a firewall enabled.
