

Raspberry Pi 4 B announced

The latest version of the popular single board computer (SBC) was announced June 24th.

This latest version has added several things that the community has requested and still comes in at just \$35. However, because one of the requested updates is the ability to purchase a model with more memory, they now have a 2 gigabyte and even a 4 gigabyte version for \$45 and \$55 respectively. This is also the faster, more modern low power DDR4 type of RAM memory.

The little computer, about the size of a deck of cards, now has a true 1GB ethernet port and a pair of USB 3.0 ports along with a pair of USB 2.0 ports. While the USB bandwidth is shared, you can see up to 10x the performance of the prior model Raspberry Pi.

Speed has increased as well. Now running at a clock speed of 1.5GHz vs 1.44GHz. While that doesn't sound like much, the new silicon on a chip (SoC) is a Broadcom BCM2711 which uses a quad-core ARM Cortex-A72 vs the a quad-core ARM Cortex-A53 that was on the previous model. Coupled with the faster RAM, many things can now run up to twice as fast as the prior Raspberry Pi model 3 B+. This new chip also has a newer video processor that brings more speed and two more features to the Pi. 4K UHD video is now possible, and if you only use 30 fps, you can now drive *two* 4K monitors with this thing. If you want 60 fps, then you can only use a single monitor, but it will do it. Incredible power at such a small price!

Wireless is basically the same with dual-band 802.11 b/g/n/ac but now has Bluetooth 5.0 instead of just 4.2.

These will sell like "hot cakes" for the first month or two, but you should be able to purchase one by the end of August 2019.

This unit was not expected to be ready until 2020, but things just fell in to place early!
