



Updates and Backups – Are You Doing Them?

For years, we've been reminding our fellow club members to keep their computers up-to-date on patches for their operating system and make routine backups (ideally just before the updates – just in case). But are you doing them? It can be devastating if you don't!

Updating the operating system is NOT enough! You MUST update your internet browser as well to help be safer when accessing the internet!

Microsoft has majorly updated their browser named Edge recently. I hear that even those using Windows 7 got this updated browser. Firefox, Opera, and Chrome will either pop messages or display an icon to let you know when an update is available, if not, your browser may not be set to watch for new updates – this feature should be turned on! Usually there is an option to have it just automatically download AND install the latest – that is usually the safest way to go.

Backups – How many times have you heard me say, or read in the newsletter, that you NEED to be doing backups of your data or complete systems on a routine basis! Well, unless you don't care about ANY information that's on your computer that is.

Backups are best when you alternate between two or more copies. For example, if you backup once a week, switch between backup devices every other week. I would also recommend that you perform a third backup to a device that you store away from your home. In fact, get a "backup buddy" and keep each other's off-site backup at the other person's house. This can also help remind the other to perform the backups. If you're concerned about them looking at your data, simply encrypt the backup first. Most external hard drives come with drive encryption software/hardware that makes it easy to do.

If nothing else, you can backup to the cloud, but that is so much slower than using an external hard drive. Still, for backing up just a handful of files that change often, this can be a great way to have a backup of those files, and have it off-site.

Oh, and don't forget the computer you carry with you everyday too! Yes, your cell phone!
