

A NEW WEB BROWSER?

Microsoft aborted their Internet Explorer web browser years ago and gave us Microsoft Edge as the replacement browser for Windows 10 based computers. While much improved over their prior product, it had trouble being competitive with other current browsers.

Well, in early 2020 Microsoft will be replacing the current Microsoft Edge web browser with a whole new version that should compete well with Chrome, Opera, and Firefox!

This new version of Microsoft Edge will actually be based on the open-source web browser called Chromium. Chromium is the core of the popular Chrome web browser as well as the less popular Opera web browser. Of course Microsoft will be enhancing their product beyond the core features with several very nice enhancements that will honestly make the industry question the need to use any other browser when using the updated Microsoft Windows 10 based PCs. It will actually be usable for way more than just downloading a "real" web browser, as it was often used for in the past.

Microsoft is playing nice too. Now that they are part of the Chromium open-source community, they are sharing some of their enhancements back with the community.

One such feature are tweaks to make the browser use less power. A welcome enhancement for all, especially laptop and Windows tablet users. If the Chromium open-source community accepts the Microsoft enhanced code and adds this in the core browser, then Opera and Google's Chrome browsers can benefit as well. This is what the open-source community is all about.

Personally, as much as I love Firefox, with it's focus on secure, non-tracking, fast, standards-based web browsing, I'm a bit excited about this new version of Microsoft Edge being a standard part of Windows 10 going forward. This should be a great browser that should work as well as Opera and Chrome, but with less "Big Brother" spying as Chrome.

Therefore, I believe the Microsoft enhancements will be more cohesive with businesses.

Caveat: This is a big change, so don't expect things to be perfect out of the gate. That said, it should be worth checking out a few months after it's release!
