Tidbits of Tech

Raspberry Pi has released a new model 4 with 8GB of RAM. In order to get beyond 4GB, you need a 64-bit OS, so they are coming out with that as well. While they are at it, they are going to change the name of the OS from Rasbian to Raspberry Pi OS. Now that you can purchase a model with 8 gigabytes of RAM, it might be worth trying out the version of Windows 10 that's made for the ARM processor like that used by the Raspberry Pi 4.

Thanks to SpaceX along with NASA, the United States of America has sent two U.S. Astronauts in to space from U.S. soil. The next day, they docked with the International Space Station. It's nice to know that a team of really smart people from a private company such as SpaceX can do so much with modern computer technology!

April of 2020 brought the latest "Long Term Support" (LTS) releases of Ubuntu and related distributions of Linux. One flavor, called Pop! OS by System76 (who sells Linux-based computers) looks pretty good and can even be run "Live" to try it out a bit before doing the actual install of the computer Operating System. I know of a small business that's already using it on several All-In-One PCs in their workplace with great results.

Elon Musk (Tesla CEO) is expected to announce their latest improvements in battery tech in the coming weeks. While this would primarily be for the Electric Vehicles (EVs) that Tesla builds, the technology could also be licensed for improvements in the batteries that power our cell phones and laptops. Tesla does sell something called a Powerwall, which could benefit greatly from this as well. The Tesla Powerwall is popular in California to power a house during the peak times after getting charged at night during lower costs for electricity as they have different cost rates during different times of the day. The Powerwall can also tie-in with solar panels from the likes of yet another Elon Musk owned company called SolarCity, a solar energy services company which is now a subsidiary of Tesla, Inc.
