Stretch out the Windows 10 Start Menu

In Windows 10, I've never understood why the Start menu only takes up a sliver of the screen by default. Give yourself more room to place your favorite app shortcuts by clicking the right edge of the Start menu, then dragging it out to the right. You can also make the Start menu taller by clicking and dragging up on the top edge.

If, after doing this, you want to cram more apps into each section of the Start menu—or add some more visual separation between sections—just head to *Settings > Personalization > Start* and enable "Show more tiles on Start." This gives each section four columns instead of the usual three.
