Microsoft Windows 10 20H2 Updates

Are you on the "latest" version of Windows 10 20H2? Even though I ran Windows Update on my computer at work and it says: "You're up to date", it appears that doesn't mean I have the latest (*optional*) version of Windows 10 installed. Looking just below the "Check for updates" button is says: "Optional quality update available" and "2021-04 Cumulative Update Preview for Windows 10 Version 20H2 for x64-based Systems (KB5001391)". Well, next time I have a few hours, maybe I'll check it out. I did glance through the info in this Microsoft article on it here: https://support.microsoft.com/en-us/topic/april-28-2021-kb5001391-os-builds-19041-964-and-19042-964-preview-fc8959e2-f2a0-4223-b56b-0ad8d9b4f96c Based on some reports of Windows updates failing and then having to revert back, I'm a little "gun shy" doing Microsoft updates these days. Make sure you backup first, have the time for going without your computer for a few hours, and make a System Restore Point first: https://support.microsoft.com/en-us/windows/create-a-system-restore-point-77e02e2a-3298-c869-9974-ef5658ea3be9 I've read where Microsoft has greatly reduced their update validation testers.

Monitor S.M.A.R.T. on your hard drive / solid-state drive

Hard drives are mechanical and so we know they'll fail eventually. Half the time, the old spinning hard drives will start to "act-up" as they start to fail, giving you a chance for a fresh backup before it bites the dust. SSDs (Solid-State Drives) on the other hand are not mechanical, but they still die eventually and usually die without any notice. Well thanks to the storage industry adding S.M.A.R.T. (Self-Monitoring, Analysis and Reporting Technology) (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/S.M.A.R.T.) to hard drives and solid-state drives, we can keep an eye on things and have a better idea when our drives might be starting to fail. There are several utilities you can use with Microsoft Windows, and I found one called <code>CrystalDiskInfo</code>. Which you can download from here: https://crystalmark.info/en/download/ This is from the same folks that brought us the famous <code>CrystalDiskMark</code> app that shows the speed results of storage drives.

I'm <u>not</u> endorsing these products as I have not even used them myself as I usually use the S.M.A.R.T. tools available in Linux/BSD/Macinstosh systems. But I had recently seen this tool used by somebody else and thought I'd at least mention that there are S.M.A.R.T. tools available for those using MS Windows. I would encourage you to read more about S.M.A.R.T. and how to use a S.M.A.R.T. monitoring tool so that you have a better idea of the health of your storage drive(s).
